- Alternatively, you can also reach the front page by going to <http://richardcheeks.com> and selecting the "Adjunct Professor" navigation button in the left frame.


### Accessing the Grades Area

At the top of this page, current students can access the grades area for the Fall 2021 semester:

1) Click on the link **Grades**

2) Click on the link  to go to the login screen

3) Enter the Username and Password for the Fall 2021 Semester as shown below:

4) Click on the "Login" button

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You should verify that you can access the Grades area as soon as possible, and if you experience difficulty with this access, notify me by email, [ce-401@windstream.net](mailto:ce-401@windstream.net), as soon as possible so we can identify the source of your access difficulty and resolve it.

You should return to the Grades area often during the semester to verify that the grade points I have entered for various activities are correct. If I make a mistake, I will correct the mistake as soon as possible upon recognizing the mistake. However, it will be much easier to make these accuracy reviews and correct mistakes when we identify the mistake as soon as possible. If you find an error in a score from early in the semester but do not report it until December, it could be impossible to verify either the mistake or the necessary correction. Furthermore, raising issues like this at the end of the semester will appear suspicious and untimely.

### Grade Tallies Sorted on Last 4 Digits of SID Number

When you get to the grades area, you will find tables of grade tallies sorted on the last 4 digits of the Student ID (SID) numbers.

**If you do not want me to use the last 4 digits of your SID number for any reason, email a preferred 4 digit PIN number, with "PIN Number Request" in the subject line, to me at [ce-401@windstream.net](mailto:ce-401@windstream.net) as soon as possible, and no later than Monday, August 30, 2021.**

If I receive a PIN Number Request from you, I will first verify that your PIN is unique and does not duplicate the last 4 digits of any current student's SID or previously requested PIN number.

- If your PIN is unique, I will approve it, I will insert your designated PIN Number into the database for this exclusive purpose, and I will let you know by return email that your PIN number is valid, or
- If your PIN Number duplicates a current student's last 4 digits of a current SID number or previously requested PIN number, I will not be able to approve your requested PIN Number. In this case, I will let you know by return email about the conflict, and I will request that you submit another PIN Number Request email if you want to replace the last 4-digits of your SID number.

**If you do not submit and get approval of a PIN Number Request by August 30, 2021, your silence and the absence of an approval will be your waiver of any claim that the use of the last 4 digits of the SID number is a violation of privacy or any other claim based on this usage.**

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### Grades Area Provides Overview and Links To Details

When you enter the Grades area, there will be a status update at the top of the page, and near the bottom of the page, there will be two tables, one for each section, showing a tabulation of grade points, current as of the most recent update. In the middle of the page, there are five links to additional tables that provide the details of the specific components of the grade. This section appears as follows:
